

<b>MODIFIED “ASYMPTOMATIC EXPOSED” CATEGORY</b>	<p>Although the CDC has outlined safe procedures for asymptomatic exposed employees to remain at work while awaiting test results and we are following these, there have been concerns raised if this is truly best practice.</p> <p>In addition it is clear that frontline staff have to be present to care for patients in most cases, but there are also support staff that have to be physically on site to do other work to keep our facilities functioning well.</p> <p>We are recommending a “modified” process for managing employees specifically in the “asymptomatic exposed” category.</p>

	3. They must self-monitor for symptoms. And will be excluded from work with development of even mild symptoms.	3. Even after a previous negative result, if an employee develops symptoms, they will potentially will be referred for repeat testing.
